Police issue advice about burglaries

Easter is a time of rest, a time to travel, visit relatives or just relax.

However, one of the most unpleasant experiences you can have when you get home is finding that your locks have been forced.

In this situation, the National Police have recommended that you stay calm and take appropriate measures to ensure your safety and resolve the situation effectively.

The first thing to do is not to enter immediately.

"This may seem obvious,

but in times of stress it is easy to give in to the impulse to enter the house to assess the damage or retrieve belongings," note the police.

However, it is important to stop and call 091.

"The intruders may still be inside or may have left some kind of trap or danger," they state.

"The police will have the necessary resources to deal with the situation and take the necessary steps to ensure the safety of you and your property.

"So call and wait for their



arrival."

Once the police have arrived and checked the scene, then you should go to the police station and do an official report, they add.

Tips to prevent burglary

include installing high security locks; keeping doors and windows locked; illuminating the exterior of your home; not leaving keys outside the house; and installing a security system.

Doorstep deception

A married couple allegedly stole jewellery and cash from an elderly resident of Almoradí who they convinced to let them into his house by pretending that one of them felt unwell.

According to the Guardia Civil, the victim reported to them on February 15 that the value of the stolen goods amounted to €3,000.

The method apparently used by the criminals in this case is so well-known to police that it is actually known as the 'glass of water' con, as them will feign illness and ask for a drink, then both enter and while one keeps

the victim busy, the other searches the house for valuables to steal

Officers based in Almoradí made a series of enquiries which led them to suspect a man and a woman, aged 54 and 59 respectively, who were married and lived in the municipality, and had a 'multitude' of previous records for property crimes, the Guardia Civil spokesman explained.


Officers managed to recover the stolen jewellery, which had been sold to a gold dealer shop in the municipality.

The couple were arrested

on February 26 on suspicion of theft and handed over to a court in Orihuela, which released them both on bail subject to precautionary measures.

The Guardia Civil reminded that they put on talks which offer practical advice to older people on how to prevent crimes like this one, as part of the force's 'Plan Mayor Seguridad'.

They also reminded that it is important not to open the front door to strangers or let them into a block of flats, 'because criminals will use any excuse to enter your

They did it for the ducks

An estate at the western edge of El Hondo natural park in Crevillente has been acquired for the project to restore the population of the marbled teal. one of the most endangered ducks in Europe.

Ecologists say the purchase 'is a massive step for the protection of threatened species of ducks, especially the marbled teal'.

Finca La Raja has a surface area of 90 hectares and was bought by the Segura river and water authority (CHS) for over €865,000, financed by the EU marbled teal LIFE project.

Forced entry to help fall victim

Local police in Almoradí reported that 'one of the most rewarding services' that they carry out is to help elderly residents, 'especially when they have suffered falls or domestic accidents'.

They noted that they received a call from a homeowner last week informing them that there may have been accident in a neighbouring property as they could hear a person calling for help.

A spokesman for the local force said officers immediately went to the home, where they found that the



front door was locked.

When a family member arrived with a key, they were unable to open it 'because it was locked from the inside'.

"Finally they were able to enter from the adjacent property and had to break the

kitchen window to get inside," he said.

They found an elderly person who had suffered a fall but was in 'stable condition'.

He noted that paramedics arrived to give treatment to the injured person.

Cough syrup con-man


Local police in Elche have arrested a man who they found to have numerous bottles of medicine and fake prescriptions.

Officers in the Carrús district saw a vehicle making suspicious manoeuvres so ordered the driver to stop and called another patrol to help them search it and the occupants.

On the floor of the car they found five bottles of Toseína, a cough syrup containing codeine, which one of the men claimed were his and he had to help him sleep.

The officers also found a compartment which was closed with screws and contained a large number of private prescriptions for the same medicine.

Suspecting that these had been obtained fraudulently, the officers went to a pharmacy to ask the staff there if the prescriptions were fake, since they contained uncom-



mon errors for this kind of document, such as saying 'medicana' instead of 'medicina' and 'coleglado' instead of 'colegiado'.

They also telephoned the doctor named on the prescriptions, who said she had never practised in Alicante province and was working for the social security, which made it impossible that these

private prescriptions had been issued by her.

The doctor also told the police that she had already reported that her stamp from the professional college of doctors had been used before to fraudulently obtain medication.

The suspect was arrested for a public health offence and falsifying documentation.

Improvements on the books for Callosa's Calvario area

Callosa de Ensarriá council is moved and topsoil laid for finalising the details of a project to improve the Calvario green area.

This project, which was launched last year, is funded by the Alicante provincial government with a €54,152

The first step will be to remove all existing waste from the area and take it to an authorised landfill site for appropriate treatment.

The sides of the path will also be cleared, gravel rethe planting of ornamental plants and shrubs, explained a council spokesperson.

A dedicated drip irrigation system will also be installed.

existing concrete pavement will also be demolished to connect the two areas of the site and underground street lighting will be installed.

Finally, the path in the Calvario green area will be paved in printed concrete with a textured finish and

The improvement works are expected to start after Easter, as the project has yet to be tendered and awarded to the contractor, 'which will be done shortly'.

At the end of last year, the Callosa d'en Sarrià town council organised a desk where residents could submit their suggestions regarding the public bus service.

All these suggestions are collected by two municipal employees at the main information desk in the town planning department of the Callosa d'en Sarrià town hall. located in Calle Ramón y Cajal, and can be handed in every morning from Monday to Friday between 08.00 and

These requests or complaints, which range from the price of the ticket to the timetables and frequency of the

buses arriving or departing from Callosa d'en Sarrià, must be handed in at this desk so that the council can ask the General Directorate of Transport of the regional government to carry out the necessary improvements requested by the citizens.

In some of the last plenary sessions, several residents of

Callosa d'en Sarrià came to present their suggestions and complaints in this regard, which they formulated at the end of the rounds of citizens' questions. The council team took note of these complaints and passed them on to the regional government.

When asked about this, Andrés Molina, the mayor of Callosa, urged the citizens to work together: "It is better and more effective to make these suggestions in just five minutes at our municipal desk than on social networks. These suggestions from the people of Callosa will not be lost".

He also promised to take them personally to Valencia to ask for more frequencies or whatever is necessary, stating that "we already got two more frequencies a few months ago after sending complaints to the regional transport and we want to improve public transport for Callosa, so my personal commitment is firm and I will take these complaints and suggestions and defend wherever it is necessary".



Hi-tech railway modelling

Idleford Junction is just one of the layouts to be found at the clubroom of the Marina Alta Model Railway Club in Teulada. It is a 00 gauge former prize-winning exhibition layout, originally constructed by members of the Bassetlaw North Notts Railway Society in the UK and exhibited more that a dozen times in the Retford area between 1992 and 2005. Since being purchased by Marina Alta Model Railway Club (MAMRC) president, Ross Ord, in 2007, the layout has been converted to Digital Command Control (DCC) with train schedules controlled by a Windows computer. This digital control system permits realistic running of multiple train routes and schedules. Fortunately, the club can boast members with the experience or curiosity to develop this system although more members with an interest in this field would be extremely welcome.

Club members are currently embarking on the construction of a brand new 00 layout on which the DCC system will need to be integrated with a conventional d.c. system, offering members opportunities to practise skills in design and construction of layouts, including building baseboards, laying and wiring track and constructing buildings and other scenery.

As well as these layouts, the Marina Alta Model Railway Club has d.c. 00 gauge and N gauge layouts which are always under continuous development.

The club is always open to new members and often has visits from guests who enjoy viewing the layouts and sometimes running their own models on them. 



Regular exercise can help you sleep

People with consistent fitness regimes are 42% less likely to have difficulty falling asleep, research suggests. Here's how to make a routine stick.

Ever noticed you tend to sleep better when you're more in the groove with your fitness regime?

A new long-term study published in the journal BMJ Open this week found that regularly exercising twice a week or more significantly cuts the risk of insomnia.

People who do regular exercise were 42% less likely to have difficulty falling asleep than those who were inactive, and 22% less likely to report symptoms of insomnia, according to the research.

Like the sound of improving your sleep by getting into regular exercise?

Everyone's fitness journey is different - so there's no one-size-all approach when it comes to exercise. But here are a few simple tips to help you get into a regular routine...

Set short-term goals

While long-term goals can provide a helpful sense

of direction towards a healthier lifestyle, focussing on far-away outcomes may dampen motivation if they seem unreachable.

"Setting short-term goals can act as a stepping stone to help you reach your target," suggests Olly Banks, personal trainer at Fitness First. "Whether it's something simple like turning up to a set amount of workouts in a week, or just staying consistent with your nutrition, short-term goals help make positive steps towards the bigger picture."

Set realistic targets

Martyn Oakey, head of fitness at Everlast Gyms, part of Sports Direct, emphasises the importance of setting attainable expec-

"It's great to be ambitious, and we all want to start as we mean to go on, but the worst thing you can do is set a goal that is too ambitious," says Oakey. "Set an attainable fitness goal, something that you can work towards that can keep you motivated."

If goals don't align with your lifestyle and what you motivation can eniov. quickly fizzle. By being realistic from the beginning,



you're more likely to stay consistent with your efforts.

Work-out with a friend

Penny Weston, a fitness and wellness expert and director of Moddershall Oaks Country Spa Retreat, says: "Keeping exercise fun and consistent is key: for many people, making it a part of your social life is the way to achieve this.

"Often, we are subconsciously looking for an excuse not to do a workout and will find plenty of other things to do instead, but if

you know you've scheduled it with a friend, you are more likely to attend as you do not want to let them

A bit of extra competition with a friend could "actually make you work a bit harder" too, Weston notes: "I know that if I run with a friend who can run further and faster than me, I will give it my all to make sure I keep up with them. The beauty of working out with someone is you are there to inspire and support each other."

Gavin Cowper, fitness

expert and owner of Exersci, adds: "Having a workout buddy also provides motivation, support and encouragement, making it easier to stay committed to your goals. Schedule regular workout sessions together, or join a fitness class or club to connect with like-minded individuals."

Diversify your workout

To prevent boredom and hitting a plateau in your fitness journey, try mixing up your workouts with different cardio, strength training and flexibility routines, or explore new classes and bootcamps in your area.
Oakey adds: "There are

hundreds of workout trends online that can transform your current workouts into something fresh and excit-

"If you're not entirely sure, consult with a personal trainer for advice on whether the trend will truly be beneficial, as well as tips on technique and incorporating this into your current workout routine in a way that avoids injury."

Celebrate your successes

As our own toughest critics, we often berate ourselves for not meeting goals. Yet, slip-ups are inevitable sometimes. So remember - setbacks are normal and not the end of the



world! Focus instead of what you are doing well.

Banks says: "If you set a short-term goal and stick to it, acknowledge and celebrate this, just as much as you would acknowledge when you've slipped up.

"We often forget we need to reward ourselves when we reach a goal, instead of just setting another one straight away and forgetting that success.'

You could even motivate yourself with some physical rewards. Oakey "Whilst it's not the solution every workout-motivation-slump, it's no secret that buying new sports gear can add a new layer of excitement for working out. So why not set a goal, and once

These are the spring jobs you need to do in the garden

After the long Easter weekend, the clocks going forward and springtime signalling buds coming into bloom, your patch of greenery is now a hub of ac-

"Making sure your garden is 'spring ready' is a wonderful way to get yourself outside and enjoy the early spring sun-shine," encourages David Domoney, gardener and chartered horticulturist.

"I always look forward to the early spring months, as there are so many excuses to get outside - and in the garden."

Weeding

One of the most important overall gardening jobs you should focus on, regardless of whether it's your flowering beds or your vegetable patch, is weeding, says Domoney.

"Making sure you are on top of perennial and annual weeds



is essential to guaranteeing a healthy garden patch.

"Hoeing a larger area will be ideal for dislodging small and annual garden weeds, whilst weeding by hand will help you to remove more established weeds," he advises.

"You could use a digging or border fork for this, or a more directed approach, using a hand fork to wrestle those weeds out from the root?

How to have the perfect vegetable patch

There are plenty of gardening tasks you can start this time of the year in your vegetable patch, suggests Domoney. "Now is the perfect time to plant onions, shallots and garlic sets - you can do this successionally to produce batches of this crop throughout the year."

Starting now, he says you can do this every few weeks, through to April, which will extend your cropping season. Also, you can plant your second-early and main crop potatoes at this time, after any risk of frost has passed, notes Domoney.

"The second earlies, 'new' potatoes, will be ready to harvest in July and August, and the main crop potatoes can be enjoyed from August to October, perfect for warm meals in cooler temperatures.'

"Additionally, early April is ideal for sowing flowering companions for your vegetable plots, such as pot marigolds, whose fragrant foliage can deter some pests from your crops," he adds.

Consistent flowering

With flowers starting

make their appearance, there are several ways you can ensure consistent flowering, advises Domoney.

"If you would like to produce a pollinator-friendly wildflower meadow, get started early by sowing seeds in trays. Then, once any risk of frost has passed, these can be sown outside for the perfect treat for your local pollinator population."

You can also use this time to plant your roses, shrubs, and climbers, which gives them plenty of time to establish before flowering in the coming months, highlights Domoney.

He also suggests sowing sunflowers, too. "A brilliant task to enjoy with your children. Sunflower seeds are large enough for small fingers to handle, and their quick growth gives children a wonderful reward for their efforts in no

Domoney's spring gardening check list...

Create a planting calendar: So you can make sure your garden beds are fully prepared for sowing seeds, what time of the year to sow them, and when you can expect to harvest.

Prep before you sow: Ensure your garden is ready to cultivate the healthiest and most productive plants by improving your soil before sowing and

Organic matter dug into the soil, any compost you have produced last year, or even composted leaves you have been saving from last autumn will all add wonderful nutrients to the soil.

Start seeds indoors: Sow some long-season seeds



which are better suited to more consistently warm soil to start them off. Some great examples include broccoli, cauliflower, and tomatoes.

Collect rainwater: Make sure you have a water butt or a similar alternative to collect rainwater. Now is the perfect time to do it, with April showers looming, as you never know when precious rainwater will be

sparsely available in summer dry spells.

Sharpen your tools: Make sure your garden tools are springready. Give them a good clean if you haven't already, making sure to put them away dry to avoid rusting. Sharpen secateurs and check the edges of spades and hand tools like trowels, in case they could do with some attention too.

International taekwondo open kicks off in La Nucía

Olympic medallists and athletes from around the world will be attending La Nucía's, Ciudad del Deporte (city of sport) from tomorrow April 4 to April 8 when it hosts the '21st international taekwondo Spanish open G1'.

The event will bring together a total of 1,900 athletes from 30 countries in four intense days of competition. It is a G1 open contest, scoring for the World Championships and the Paris 2024 Olympics. It will serve as a preparatory event for the European Championships to be held in Serbia in May.

Starting on Thursday, the

event will take place in two of the town's sports pavilions: Camilo Cano (competition) and La Muixara (training and warmup), with the best international and national taekwondists competing, including those who will make up the Spanish national team, many of whom have a guaranteed place at the Paris 2024 Olympic Games.

The event presentation was attended by Jesús Castellanos, president of the royal Spanish taekwondo federation and Bernabé Cano, mayor of La Nucía.

On Thursday, April 4 the poomsae and freestyle categories will compete. From here, the national team that will represent Spain at the next European Championships will be selected.

Combats will take place from April 5 in the Camilo Cano pavilion in cadet, junior, master and senior categories. A total of six competition rinks will be set up on the central court of the pavilion

On Friday, April 5 it will be the turn of the cadet combat category.

On Saturday, April 6, the junior and masters will compete in combat, and on Sunday it is the turn of the senior combat cat-

The Spanish delegation will be made up of 41 athletes, in-

cluding Hugo Arillo, Joan Jor-
